## P4/5 Learning activities and GLOW for school closure

Some suggested activities to keep learning while the school is closed.

- o Find a space in your garden to clear and plant wildflowers.
- o Plant a small vegetable garden.
- o Carry out a habitat survey in your garden or local area
  - > Record your results
  - Classify the living things you find
  - > Research the living things to find out more about their life cycle, food, predators etc
  - > Display your results be creative
- Watch a wildlife film, take notes as you watch recording any interesting information.
- o Create your own wildlife film.
- Practise your times tables find an interesting way to do it. Here are some suggestions but I'm sure you can think of other ways too.
  - > Tables bingo
  - > Oreo
  - > Times tables races
  - > Make a matching pairs times tables game
  - > Make a links card game with times tables
- Write a story using as many of your spelling words as you can.
- o Read a style of book you haven't read before.
- Make lunch for everyone in the house.
- Bake a cake using fruit or vegetable as an ingredient.
- Revise your spelling words think of a creative way of doing it, let your imagination go!

- Take some abstract photographs. Practise the skills you have been learning in school.
- Draw/paint abstract pictures or challenge yourself to create photorealism instead.
- Challenge yourself to see how long you can keep a ball in the air using only the volleyball passing/hitting techniques.
- Learn a new trick with a football/skipping rope/ball or other type of equipment.
- Create random calculations to revise addition and subtraction strategies. Use
  different strategies to complete different calculations.
- o Read a section of a book, choose a book detective task to complete then continue the next section of the book.
- Write your own book. It could be a comic book, graphic novel, story book, or nonfiction and remember to include illustrations or diagrams.
- Make a fantastic model with Lego, blocks, K'nex, junk etc. Then draw it carefully to show to the class.
- Create a matching pairs game in French e.g. numbers, animals or colours
