I have put some general links and then some activities/suggestions in curricular areas. Hope it is useful.

## CORE TEACHING AND LEARNING

Lessons will be appearing on Google Classroom, the children will be able to access this via a tile on their GLOW page. If the children complete their set tasks they can access other learning ideas set out below:-

Please note that daily tasks will be available for a full 24 hours as it is understood that children will access their learning at different times of the day depending on availability of devices. It is possible to connect to GLOW through laptops, ipads, iphones and indeed XBOX and PS4, there are tutorials online for the latter two options. There will be a daily numeracy, literacy and either topic/expressive art assignment.

### LITERACY

You could have a virtual book group with your friends, you could write or present book reviews to each other and suggest authors or books your classmates may enjoy.

#### **MATHS**

As well as using Sumdog and Top Marks (links on GLOW page) pupils can also concentrate on telling the time, they could look at timetables for buses and trains online and plan journeys. They can cook at home as measuring weighing out and timing are all important skills. Times tables always need a bit of polishing! Sumdog challenges will be updated from time to time to make sure that key skills are kept fresh.

## **TOPIC**

Pupils can access TigTag through GLOW and can continue to watch and enjoy the clips about Earthquakes. Pupils could continue to research an Earthquake or volcano of their choice and perhaps use their ICT skills to create a powerpoint to share via GLOW. They could make a poster at home, using different papers and colours. They could continue to research areas of Japan which interest them and keep a scrap book of findings.
