Great Achievements in Term 4!



John Muir Award-Well-done to our Primary 7 pupils for their hard work on achieving their John Muir awards. This meant completing four sections; Discover, Explore, Conserve and Share. The pupils planned and carried out each section of the award. The creativity demonstrated, the responsibility taken and the enthusiasm for the natural world was great to see. We trust that this

has enhanced their awareness of wild places and that they enjoyed taking responsibility for them and sharing their experience. The John Muir Award is a progressive scheme and we hope that our pupils will continue to create positive connections with nature.

Young Volunteers Awards-As a school we actively encourage our Senior Pupils to become involved in the iVolunteer Awards Scheme. Several of our Primary 7 pupils have been doing a fantastic job volunteering both at school and in the community. Curriculum News this Term!

Primary 6 and 7 pupils attended 'The Safe' based in the Gordon Barracks, Aberdeen! A visit to 'The Safe' is like no other field trip. The facility is a one-stop safety shop that takes visitors on an unforgettable safety adventure that gives real-life context to the learning experience. An interactive facility, where the Absafe team deliver engaging, fun and informative sessions that teach young people about everyday hazards and how to deal with them, including Road safety, Railway safety, Home Safety, Fire Safety, Solvent Misuse, Anti-social behaviour, Cyberbullying and Security. Thank you to the PSC for funding the buses and entry fee to this venue for Primary 7 pupils and our thanks to Mrs McRae's Primary 6 class for funding this event for all Primary 6 pupils with their competition prize money.

Primary 7 pupils attended Lectures for Schools held at Aberdeen University run by The Hydrographic Society - Scotland Branch. In their 8th annual Schools Lectures they presented Surveying for the Energy Industry with talks about what surveying is, new technology and gadgets used in surveying and talks from people who have worked offshore. The aim was to inspire young people from Primary 7 upwards to consider science subjects when they make their choices for Nat5 and beyond, and also to have fun while learning. Our Primary 7 pupils were super ambassadors for Fishermoss School at this event and stood out from the crowd for all the right reasons.

As part of the event, there was the opportunity for schools to participate in a range of poster competitions. Our Primary 7 pupils entered and did us proud by **Winning** the following challenging briefs.....

'An oil company needs a new subsea map of their oil field to help them plan how to dismantle it. The oil field contains two platforms that are anchored to the seabed and lots of pipelines that run between the seabed well, the platforms and the shore. You have an ROV (Remotely Operated Vehicle) plus a ship, but YOU have to decide the kind of equipment you would put on your ROV to produce the new map and why you would need this equipment'.

'Your school needs an updated plan of the school grounds. Your group has been asked to produce a scale map showing one part of the school buildings and surrounding areas. You will also need to describe how you created your plan, the equipment you used, the problems you found and how you solved them.'

All pupils in Primary 5 to 7 have successfully completed their Young Emergency Aider Award Scheme First Aid Training at First Level delivered by Grampian Training services. Our current Primary 5 and 6 pupils will build on this training going forward to the next level. We strongly believe at Fishermoss that first-aid training is a basic life skill everyone should learn. We are so very grateful once again to our PSC for funding this training.

We continue to benefit from online workshops and this term **Primary 7** participated in an **Eco Schools** Live Lesson and **Primary 6** & **Primary 6/7** had a live lesson with the **Scottish Parliament on devolution**, **elections**, and **decision-making processes in Scotland**.

All classes enjoyed Silent Discos in the local area as part of our Health & Wellbeing! Our pupils certainly turned some heads! A great time was had by all!

Primary 5 took part in a workshop with Aberdeen University Business School focussing on Employability as part of our Developing the Young workforce agenda!

Primary 2/3, Primary 3 & Primary 3/4 experienced a singing workshop provided by the **National Youth Choir of Scotland**. The pupils learned a variety of fun songs and rhymes to help with rhythm and diction. These workshops are run in the hope of finding new recruits for the National Youth Choir of Scotland, Aberdeen Choir.



Delivering the Curriculum 'Oot and Aboot'

This term has been particularly active with outings to all sorts of interesting places for all our classes. These educational excursions further enhance our delivery of the curriculum. Thanks yet again to the **PSC** for funding our School Trips. Here is a whistle stop tour and all experienced lovely weather.....

Our **Primary 1** pupils kept it eco and local as they walked to **Farm Stop** for an interactive day with the animals!

Primary 2 took a trip to **Stonehaven Beach** as a Social Studies focus on **Global Citizenship** to increase pupils' awareness of biodiversity, their awareness of the significance of sea and marine life and why it needs protection and to enhance their awareness of human impact on the environment in relation to pollution and conservation.

Primary 2/3, Primary 3 & Primary 3/4 enjoyed a day at St Cyrus Beach to give pupils a more indepth knowledge of the topics 'In the Water' and 'Living Things'.

Primary 4/5 & Primary 5 visited **St Machar Cathedral**, in old Aberdeen, to further develop their knowledge of the Scottish Wars of Independence and to investigate how local area fits with national history. They also enjoyed the splendour of neighbouring Seaton Park!

Primary 6, Primary 6/7 & Primary 7, as previously shared, were all off to Absafe!

Their names will go up on our Roll of Honour at the front of the school.
