At Fishermoss School all pupils are 'Global Warriors'. Being a Global Warrior is about knowing and understanding our world and having the right values, knowledge and skills to make the world a better place. It is about positive relationships and building safe, happy and healthy communities. At

Class representatives often take on the role of the spokesperson to share class discussions and views through TEAMs. We greatly value and respect the views of our pupils and the vital part they play in making decisions at school.

Curriculum News this Term!

Primary 1 to Primary 7 classes experienced an **outdoor session** with Keilidh Ewan, Education and Outreach Officer with the **River Dee Trust**. The sessions focused on **River Dee Wildlife** and **Fishing on the Dee** with an emphasis on nature appreciation, fun and teamwork to promote health and wellbeing. The River Dee Trust is a community-based charitable company.

Primary 5 took a trip into Aberdeen to visit the Maritime Museum as part of their Social Studies topic. They experienced a workshop where they were able to handle objects related to the history of the fishing industry in Aberdeen, including whaling. A quiz was completed relating to fishing and many fascinating objects were discovered by the pupils. Primary 5 also had a visit to the classroom by Joey Wilson, our School Cook. She shared information and answered questions about her husband's job as a lobster fisherman. She brought some cooked lobster for the class to look closely at and discussed the life cycle of the lobster.

Primary 5 to 7 classes enjoyed 3 taster sessions this term arranged through **Active Schools** with **Mackie Rugby Club's** new development officer, Scott Simpson. We hope this has inspired some of our pupils to consider rugby as a sport they would like to get involved with. Our pupils are to be commended for their enthusiasm as it was not always blue skies, and mud did feature quite a bit!





Primary 3/4 & Primary 4 are responsible for organising our participation in the Rotary Shoe Box Appeal this year, as part of their work as Global Warriors. They have been busy preparing high quality PowerPoint presentations in the hope that they will encourage as many pupils as possible to share the message at home to help those less fortunate to have a special Christmas Day! Assemblies

Assemblies are held every Wednesday afternoon this term for P1 to P3/4 & P4 to P7. As parents, you will be invited to attend your child's/children's 'Class Assembly' where the class will be involved in the creation and delivery of the assembly. Details will appear in class newsletters as appropriate. For children in our Primary 1 & P1/2 classes, this will take the form of a Nativity next term.

Our assemblies very much focus on our school's vision, values and aims. The emphasis being on supporting our pupils to become successful learners with enthusiasm and motivation for learning; confident individuals with physical, mental & emotional wellbeing and self-respect and ambition; responsible citizens with respect for others and a commitment to participate responsibly in their community and the wider world and also effective contributors, who can communicate, work together, be creative and enterprising.

Regular features at assembly include us focusing on 'Good News about Me' where pupils share wider achievements and the 'Golden Book' where individual pupils are given a special mention for significant effort in work, and also in relation to their class charter and the Golden Rules. 'Learning Celebration' assemblies focus on curriculum subject areas where pupils have been hardworking, have done particularly well and certificates are presented.

Assemblies this term included our new Pupil Council Representatives being introduced and information on their role was shared. We also had a focus on our School's motto, values, Children's rights, the well-being indicators and the Golden Rules and what the expectations are for all in the playground, classroom and in the wider community. We have shared the role of all pupils as Global Warriors and it being their responsibility to be the best they can be. As previously shared, pupils from Primary 3/4 & Primary 4 took the lead in sharing presentations about the Shoe Box Appeal.
