
P5 newsletter January 2024

Dear parents/carers.

I would like to wish you all a very **Happy New Year** and trust that you enjoyed some time over the holidays enjoying catching up with family and friends.



In Literacy, the children will be looking closely at fact and opinion and successful, appropriate ways to share information. This will include, in Listening and Talking, sharing and listening to opinions, debating and using group tasks to learn more about appropriate strategies to share ideas and collaborate. When reading the children will be learning more about techniques the writer uses to persuade or share information in an interesting, relevant way. They will then be experimenting with these techniques in their own writing.

Health and Wellbeing this term will give the class an opportunity to explore empathy and understanding other people's behaviour. This knowledge will be used in group tasks where the emphasis will be on cooperating, using different strengths in a team, supporting each other and the importance of self-respect and the respect for others. They will be looking at the influences media and peers have on themselves and others and how this affects the choices they make. We will continue working with P1/2 and there will be a new opportunity to work with younger children to develop a sense of responsibility, empathy and confidence. Small groups of children from P5 will take turns to visit and play with the nursery children on a weekly basis.

The class Social Studies topic this term is the 1950s and 1960s. This history based topic will encompass all aspects of life for children in these decades. During this topic, the children will learn about how Scotland has been influenced by things that happened in the 50s and 60s, complete some research and investigate Scotland's history. They will have the opportunity to learn games, cook food, compare how the school day has changed, compare technologies, design for the future, recreate TV shows and other tasks. The class will be planning their topic this week so if you have any suggestions, please have a chat at home and



encourage your child to share your ideas. Maybe some older relatives would be willing to come in and be interviewed about their childhood during these decades.

Reading **homework** will be issued on either Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Friday accompanied with a book detective task to complete. There will also be a homework task map on Google Classroom for additional tasks. The children can share these with me through Classroom or by email or bring them in to school if they wish to do so.

In P5 for the next 6 weeks, we have a student teacher joining us. Miss MacFarlane was in for a visit last term and the children have already made her feel very welcome in the classroom.
