Some Curriculum News from this Term!

Our 'Show & Tell Curriculum Event' held on 21st February was an opportunity for parents to visit their child's/children's classroom(s) to find out more about the experiences their child is having at school. Our pupils had a lead role in this event and were responsible for sharing their learning. We had a fantastic turnout with a total of 80% of pupils and 206 families represented which was approximately 300 parents coming into school for this event! This is significant support from our Fishermoss Family which is greatly appreciated.

Earlier this term our school welcomed Aberdeenshire Life Education Centre (ALEC). ALEC is part of Coram Life Education, a charity providing a Health & Well-being Education Programme. All children from Primary 1 to Primary 7 attended a workshop where topics included My Wonderful Body, It's Great to Be Me, Feelings, All About Me and Friends etc. These workshops complement our school's Health and Wellbeing Programme.

All **Primary 6** pupils participated in **Playleader Training** with our **Active Schools Coordinator** and a former Fishermoss pupil who is now a Robert Gordon's University (RGU) student. These sessions took place over 6 weeks. Congratulations to all pupils for passing! They will have the opportunity to use their skills next term with another RGU student leading them in playground leadership with our younger pupils.

Primary 6 and Primary 7 have experienced Physical Education delivered by Aberdeen Football Club Community Trust. These sessions have been delivered by Portlethen Academy pupils. They focused on teamwork and endurance through different fitness exercises and games. We greatly value opportunities to work with Portlethen Academy pupils and to support their development of leadership skills.... many will be former pupils whom we champion!

Primary 1/2 & **Primary 5** have been buddying up this term and enjoyed an adventure at the local **Moss**, amongst other fun activities together!



All pupils received a £1 World Book Day token this term which entitled them to a free £1 World Book Day book from participating stores such as ASDA and various bookshops.

Primary 7 have participated in an Eco Schools live lesson all about the impact of vapes and e cigarettes on the environment.

Two Primary 7 teams were put forward to the Portlethen District Primary Schools Rotary Quiz. Both teams did extremely well competing against Newtonhill, Hillside and Portlethen.

Congratulations to Isla Davis, Cole Jamieson, Jamie Middleton & William Miller who came 3rd. Well done also to Layla Mitchell, Ellie Gray, Joe Thomson & Campbell Murray. All are to be commended for their hard work and effort preparing for the quiz. This was one of many transition events our Primary 7 pupils will experience. All Primary 7 pupils from across the cluster joined together at Portlethen Academy for this event.

Euroquiz is an annual project open to all Primary 6 pupils across Scotland, which sees teams working together to broaden their knowledge of Europe and the wider world. Subjects covered include languages, history, geography, culture and European affairs. Heats take place in local authorities, with the winning teams progressing to the National Euroquiz Final held in the Debating Chamber of the Scottish Parliament in June. All Fishermoss Primary 6 pupils participated in the preliminaries of the Euro Quiz. They cooperated in teams of 3 or 4 to complete 4 rounds of questions. Our two top scoring teams were comprised of Jayden Taylor, Innis Mathers, Jodie Ferguson, Sasha Rimsa, Harley Horne, Bradley Burnett, Freddie Docherty & Charlie Tait. Unfortunately, we fell just short of qualifying for the next round. The competition was extrremely high! Everyone taking part must be congratulated for an excellent effort, their hard work and enthusiasm!

The "Food for Thought" campaign aims to provide a full year of fresh fruit to schools. Several of our parents work at the Amazon site and wanted to lend a hand in a small way to their local community. We have very much benefitted as a school from support from Amazon. We are receiving 100 pieces of fresh fruit weekly, and these are available for pupils in P3/4-P7 in the

senior part of the school. We are operating it like a fruit bowl at home where pupils can help themselves if they need a snack for break. If staff are aware of younger pupils who are short of a

play piece they also benefit too! It is anticipated that the fruit supply will last for 12 months which is a great support.

Lethan Care Home delivered Easter bonnets that residents had decorated as a gift to Fishermoss pupils. Our Primary 7 pupils visited residents in February to entertain them with items from their Burns themed Assembly!

Teaching and support staff were involved in a range of Professional Learning Activities linked with our School Improvement Plan, with an emphasis on the wellbeing, equality and inclusion of all learners as global citizens. We continued our work on Inclusive Classrooms and we also focused on Rights Respecting Schools & Pastoral Notes.

Assemblies

We have enjoyed seeing many of our pupils take the lead in class assemblies this term and it has been great for them to perform to an audience of parents and family members.

Primary 7 & Primary 6/7 gave a very Scottish themed assembly providing a flavour of what happens at a **Burns Supper**. We enjoyed singing, poetry, drama sketches, dance and their very amusing toasts, or 'roasts' as they called them, to the lassies and laddies! With this being, for many of them, their last class assembly at Primary School they certainly showcased a wide range of skills and talent developed over the years.

Primary 4 also had a Scottish themed Assembly, where they confidently showcased their learning. They are worthy of a career with the Scottish Tourist Board. It was great to see many aspects of the curriculum covered in their presentation.

Primary 3 shared all they have been learning in their class project on The Egyptians. We got a real feel for what life was like living in Ancient Egypt. An all-round confident performance with singing and drama in the mix! They should be proud of all their work!

Primary 2 finished off our class assemblies for the term with an assembly on **Castles**. Their performance and presentation skills were beyond anything you would expect from Primary 2 pupils! Super singing, dancing and artwork shared in addition to their amazing ability to memorise their words! They clearly had a lot of fun learning in this topic.




All classes from Primary 1 to Primary 7 shared what they had learned about Fairtrade and what it means to the global community. There were strong links made to people's rights. We hope our pupils have been spreading the Fair-Trade message at home too!

We have welcomed visitors to our assemblies this past term.....Mrs Storey one of our teachers led an assembly on Autism, we also held a Global Warrior Assembly where we celebrated our 7th Eco Schools Green Flag and we have enjoyed Learning Celebration assemblies too. We concluded the term with an assembly focus on why we celebrate Easter!

Rights Respecting Schools Award

We are in the process of further developing our pupils' learning about, and promoting, Children's Rights. Rights being things that we need to survive, grow and develop. The United Nation's Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) lists these rights in the form of 'Articles'. Countries around the world follow the UNCRC in a commitment to protecting children by realising their rights. In Scotland, the UNCRC is being incorporated into law, and it underpins our wellbeing approach. Schools are expected to explore children's rights as part of learning and teaching. There are many ways Fishermoss School highlights the rights of the child and to help recognise our progress we are signed up to UNICEF's Rights Respecting School Award programme. Fishermoss is currently applying for a Bronze Award which means that our school has shown that we are committed to respecting children's rights. We have also created our Action Plan for a Silver Award and are working hard to show that we know and understand rights and encourage adults and children alike to respect the rights of others.

Every class in Fishermoss School has an individual Class Charter. Each class decided on a group of articles which were deemed 'most relevant', even though no one right is more important that another. A charter helps us reflect on what we need, and actions to take in class, to ensure everyone feels that their rights are met. Each class has collaboratively designed and created a display. Below you can see some examples of class charters which you hopefully spotted at our Curriculum Show & Tell event.
