Great Achievements in Term 4!



John Muir Award-Well-done to our Primary 7 pupils for their hard work on achieving their John Muir awards. This meant completing four sections; Discover, Explore, Conserve and Share. The pupils planned and carried out each section of the award. The creativity demonstrated, the responsibility taken and the enthusiasm for the natural world was great to see. We trust that this

has enhanced their awareness of wild places and that they enjoyed taking responsibility for them and sharing their experience. The John Muir Award is a progressive scheme, and we hope that our pupils will continue to create positive connections with nature.

Young Volunteers Awards-As a school we actively encourage our Senior Pupils to be involved in the iVolunteer Awards Scheme. 

Curriculum News this Term!

Primary 7 pupils attended Lectures for Schools held at Aberdeen University run by The Hydrographic Society - Scotland Branch. In their 8th annual Schools Lectures they presented Surveying for the Energy Industry with talks about what surveying is, new technology and gadgets used in surveying and talks from people who have worked offshore. The aim was to inspire young people from Primary 7 upwards to consider science subjects when they make their choices for Nat5 and beyond, and to have fun while learning. Our Primary 7 pupils were super ambassadors for Fishermoss School at this event and stood out from the crowd for all the right reasons.



As part of the event, there was the opportunity for schools to participate in a range of poster competitions. Our Primary 7 pupils did us proud with their entries and **Isla Davis** won the top prize of £150 for school entries for the following brief.....

'Your school needs an updated plan of the school grounds. Your group has been asked to produce a scale map showing one part of the school buildings and surrounding areas. You will also need to describe how you created your plan, the equipment you used, the problems you found and how you solved them.' Congratulations to Rowyn Alexander for winning the trophy for the Remotely Operated Vehicle Simulator game.

Aberdeenshire Student Chromebook Roadshow.....Primary 7 & Primary 6/7 pupils attended a 90minute interactive event at school designed to enhance skills in a hands-on and fun experience. Together they discovered the Accessibility settings, Chrome keys and the Touch Pad across multiple games and websites that lend themselves well to multidisciplinary learning. They had the opportunity to pull together their learning in teams or solo efforts to beat the Digital Escape Room.

Primary 6 attended a Waterstone's virtual **Author Live event** with **A.E Steadman** who was the author of their last two class novels.

All pupils in Primaries 6 & 7 attended an online Kooth session to find out more about this service. Kooth is a free, safe and anonymous resource for all 10-18-year-olds living in Aberdeenshire. The online platform offers many different features including a Kooth magazine, discussion boards, mini self-care activities and journalling/goal setting tools - all to help support better emotional and mental health and wellbeing for our young people.

Primary 2/3, Primary 3 & Primary 3/4 experienced a singing workshop provided by the **National Youth Choir of Scotland**. The pupils learned a variety of fun songs and rhymes to help with rhythm and diction. These workshops are run in the hope of finding new recruits for the National Youth Choir of Scotland, Aberdeen Choir.

Kodaly Music sessions - As part of our Expressive Arts Curriculum, all classes Primary 1 to Primary 7, enjoyed blocks of Kodaly Music. The Kodály method is an approach to music education rooted in the idea that music should be a social and cultural experience. The Kodály approach asserts that musical concepts, creativity, and collaboration are best taught in group music lessons. Mrs Okumu, or 'Mrs O' as she is affectionately known by pupils, loves coming to Fishermoss School to deliver Kodaly Music lessons and we love having her here!

Financial Education – All pupils in Primary 3 to Primary 7 attended online Financial Capability workshops delivered by Money Advice Scotland. Workshops included Budgeting for a Day Out, Shopping Offers, an Introduction to Money, Banking & Borrowing and Budgeting for a Birthday Party.

Primary 3/4 & Primary 4 visited **St Machar Cathedral**, in Old Aberdeen, to further develop their knowledge of the Scottish Wars of Independence and to investigate how local area fits with national history. They also enjoyed the splendour of neighbouring Seaton Park!

It has been great to welcome lots of family members to our class assemblies this term, which included the following.....

Primary 2/3 took us on their learning journey from this term, sharing lots of different experiences including Health & Wellbeing, Science and French with a musical extravaganza in the mix. A very confident and polished performance.

Primary 3/4 delivered a confident performance showcasing their learning from their Vikings project! Again, a confident performance and they impressed us with how well they had remembered their lines, with no prompt notes.

Primary 6 presented the very tragic story of the Titanic and the aftermath. The class had super stage presence and demonstrated real maturity in the way they shared these events. A powerful and emotional performance to be proud of.

Our **Primary 7s** created a special **Leavers' Assembly** for us all and their families. It is always special to hear pupils share memories of their time at Fishermoss. All classes showcased their 'Learning for Sustainability' work. It was great to hear from every class the range of experiences across the school from John Muir, Play Leaders, Junior Road Safety Officers, Fair Trade Focus, Shoe Box Appeal, Climate Change, Outdoor learning experiences and our Eco Schools Adventure! So many rich learning opportunities developing a broad skill set!

Primary 5 had the role of being our **Digital Leaders** this year and they have done this with great enthusiasm, taking their new role extremely seriously. They educated us all about online safety, what makes a secure password, how to keep information about yourself private online, our digital footprint, online stranger danger, safe websites and our role as digital citizens where the values of kindness and respect are as important.

We also welcomed David Young, who spoke about what the bible says about how we should treat each other. We have as always enjoyed our Learning Celebration Assemblies, where pupils achieve certificates and share their learning with other classes, in addition to our Golden Book. We also had our Presentations Assembly where medals and certificates were handed out following Sports Day, in addition to certificates for our Young Leaders, STEM awards and Basic Life Skills awards.
